Dear Steven,

This letter is to notify you of the resolution of a report filed by MIT Police regarding the night of September 14th, 2019. The report indicated that the officer was dispatched to Chi Phi for a noise complaint and upon arrival the officer noted that there was no noise that could be heard outside of the house, but that it was the second call regarding noise that was made to MIT Police that night. Based on this information, Chi Phi may have violated the following policy from the MIT Mind and Hand Book:

MIT Mind and Hand Book II (6). Disorderly Conduct

After reviewing your response, I have decided to resolve this case administratively. Based on the totality of the information available to me, I have found Chi Phi not responsible for violating the disorderly conduct policy because your account and the police report notes that there was no noise coming from Chi Phi at the time of the Officer's visit and that the noise, if any, was the result of guests lingering around the premises. As always remember that MIT Police is a great resource to utilize when crowds are becoming hard to control outside of your house because, as you said, the noise can lead to frustrations with your neighbors.
