Dear Ariel,

This letter is to notify you of the resolution of a complaint filed by MIT Facilities regarding the night of July 4th, 2019. According to the report, the facilities employee noticed people on the roof of Phi Beta Epsilon the night of the Fourth of July. Based on this information, Phi Beta Epsilon may have violated the following policy from the FSILG Social Events Policy:

FSILG Social Events Policy

Special House Events

9. Roof decks may be used for Special House Events, but only by explicit, written approval of the Associate Dean/Director of the FSILG Office

After reviewing your response, I have decided to resolve this case administratively. Based on the totality of the information available to me, I have found Phi Beta Epsilon not responsible for violating the Special House Events policy because while members and alumni were in fact on the roof during the fourth of July, it was for the purposes of ensuring members of other fraternities stay off the roof of Phi Beta Epsilon, as such this does not count as an event. It would probably be advisable for future Fourth of Julys to notify the FSILG Office if there is going to be an effort to watch the roof so the necessary parties may be aware in the future.
