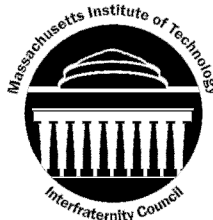

- Lauren Avalos – New CPW Coordinator
 - She wants us to help make CPW better. They expect 1000 prefrosh, 800 parents, and 600 events.
 - CPW takes place from Thursday, April 15 – Sunday, April 19. Even though Monday is Patriots Day holiday, prefrosh will not be staying.
 - CPW information can be found on the website.
 - We want hosts to be responsible in order to make the prefrosh feel safe. We have 65 Fraternity hosts signed up. Encourage your Brothers to sign up. The deadline is March 20. You will know you were assigned a prefrosh the week before CPW.
 - CPW Kickoff is Sunday, April 12 in 10-250.
 - There is a max of 10 prefrosh per house, and a max of 7 potential varsity athletes.
 - They need volunteers, not just hosts (TIM the Beaver, Workers for the registration desk, etc.).
 - If you are interested in reserving space for the CPW festival, apply by March 13th.
- Elizabeth C Young was unable to make the meeting.
 - There have been some major changes to O-Leader applications this year.
 - The deadline to apply to be an O-Leader is February 26th. They are hiring 50 O-Leaders instead of 100 (approximately 30 male positions). They are also hiring O-Leader captains (You must be a former O-Leader). There are no set caps per house; they select the best candidates. You need a letter of reference. There is a strict screening process. You do *not* have to be here for the summer to be considered.
 - There is no more airport shuttle this year.
 - There is also 3 Orientation Coordinator positions available; you must apply by a hard copy.
- David Hutchings - President
 - REX/Recruitment agreement is an agreement between IFC/Panhel/DormCon. Currently, fraternities agree not to wear letters during REX, etc., and DormCon agrees not to hold events during rush.
 - We have a lot of the restrictions in place to (1) make sure that we don't interfere with REX and (2) reduce risk of fraternities being blamed for incidents involving Freshmen during orientation.
 - One of the main issues with past REX agreements was that it was unenforceable. A proposed solution is to set up a more serious JudComm with Dave Kennedy and Kaya Miller to enforce fractions.
 - Note: Hazing will be JudComm issue and your national organization will be called.
