1. Actionable Items

2. MIT Police Department

- a. Neighbors already calling reports to BPD
- b. Problem with rush was cooking equipment on the streets and sidewalks. Understand that there weren't many alternatives, but this drew outsiders.
- c. If BPD sees overcrowding at one address, they will make an example of that address. MIT Police are worried that they are going to institute social host law
- d. BPD will fine and hold individuals criminally responsible
- e. Can call MIT police to help with overcrowding, they have other things to do but can try to help if they have time
- f. Be cognisant who you are letting into the front door
- g. If you get jammed up, especially medically, please give MIT police a call

3. COVID / Judy Robinson / Liz Jason

- a. Requests about getting more KN95 masks to houses, office is working on it
- b. Case / COVID FSILG newsletter. Still on the table, but staff bandwidth might be an issue. Will try to get this done
- c. Compliance with testing
 - i. Undergraduate testing compliance is 92%
 - ii. FSILG testing compliance is 85%
 - iii. Every week, receive an email about compliance and reminding houses to stay compliant
- d. Across the river testing locations: not a realistic option (no staff and no location)
- e. Could FSILGs pick up a large box of tests for the house? Asked, at this time medical is not at a place where they want to hand out large supplies to students. Since its a medical supply, they cannot hand it out. If you go to testing sites, you can take extras for other members
- f. Can we get a list of members out of compliance? No since it is a medical privacy issue
- g. Do pledges count? No, only members of the house
