This letter is to notify you of the resolution of a report from MIT Police regarding an incident that occurred on April 17<sup>th</sup>, 2023. The report stated that an officer responded to a noise complaint at Theta Chi, and shut off outside DJ music. Based on this information, Theta Chi may have violated the following policies:

## MIT Mind and Hand Book

## II (7). Disorderly Conduct

MIT prohibits disorderly conduct. Disorderly conduct is defined as any unreasonable or reckless conduct by an individual or group that is inherently or potentially unsafe to other persons or to their real or personal property, and/or any behavior that disrupts the peace or interferes with the normal operation of the Institute or Institute-sponsored activities. Disorderly conduct includes making unreasonable noise, disrupting a lawful meeting, obstructing pedestrian or vehicle traffic, or creating a hazardous situation.

After reviewing the police report and your response, I have decided to resolve this case administratively. Based on the information provided, I find Theta Chi responsible for all policy violations. Based on the police report, there was sufficient noise created to lead to a noise complaint report.

While Theta Chi was found responsible for all policy violations, I am only issuing a warning since Theta Chi cooperated with police and complainants and resolved any issues. I strongly encourage your chapter to be cognizant of noise in the future.
